Overview:

In addition, explore digital media to support learning and formative as well as authentic assessment across the curriculum. An essential element of the workshop is to work together in a constructivist learning environment, and by using global collaboration tools, work on a tangible product(s) that can be used immediately in the classroom. This workshop is designed to open doors to new modes of teaching and learning and focus on the learner (teacher and student) as a communicator, collaborator and creator.

During this workshop, participants will deepen understanding of how to:

- integrate the use of Web 2.0 tools into the daily life of an educator;
- develop quality digital assessment tasks and associated rubrics; and,
- support project-based digital learning.

Target Audience:

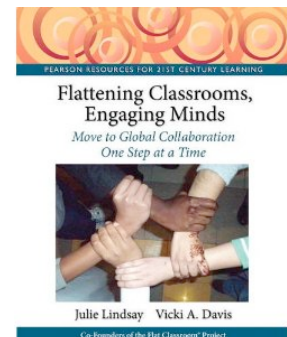
